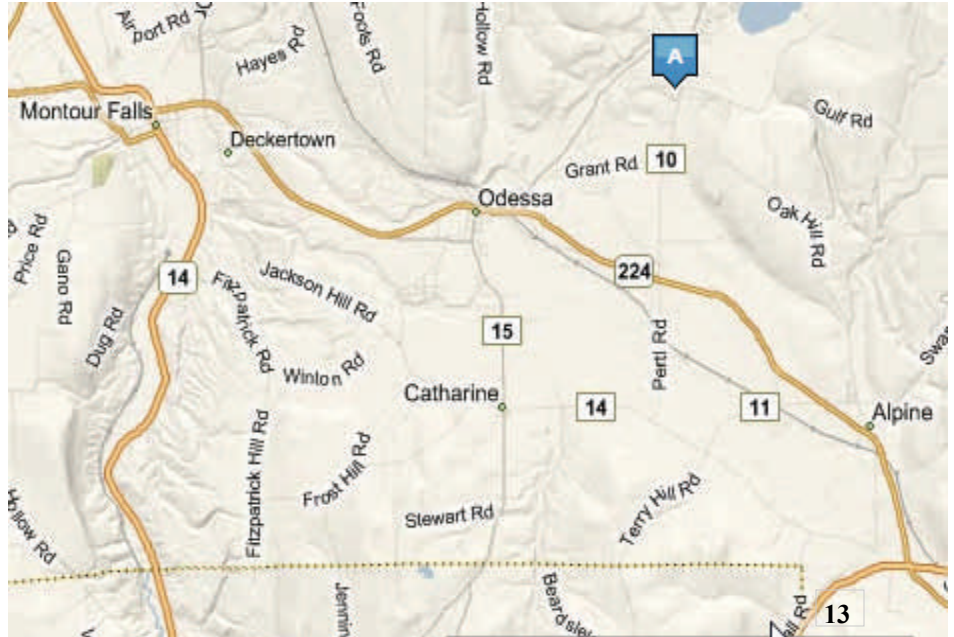




Celebrate Spring by Celebrating the Importance of Animals in Our Lives Annual Meeting March 21st

And how did we celebrate???? By having a spay/neuter clinic, of course. However this time, instead of just spaying the normal 30 to 35 dogs and cats that Dr. Murley normally alters in a day, she took time to do spay/neuter surgery on a bunch of cat and dog key chains for kids that might be coming with their parents to pick up their beloved pets after surgery.

Silly maybe—but what a great way to talk to kids about spay/neuter—with a furry key chain, games and puzzle pages. And I'm sure it was a lot less exhausting than her normal day.



The Humane Society of the United States designated February 24th of this year as Spay Day—the 15th Annual Spay Day in America. Spay/neuter surgery is still the only effective humane way to decrease overpopulation so as to decrease euthanasia rates in our nation's shelters.



In the past 14 years that Spay Day USA has been celebrated, 1,415,500 animals have been spayed and neutered nationally on Spay Day alone.

Our commitment to spay/neuter is the Humane Society's most important program, with 4800 having been spayed or neutered in our income eligible clinics since January of 2001. In addition to our clinics, we also offer spay/neuter assistance certificates that helps defray costs at your local vet.

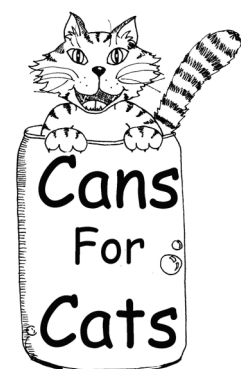
Kitten season is upon us!!

**Easter Lily
Hazardous to
Cats**

The Easter lily is one of the most poisonous houseplants to cats that chew on or eat any part of the plant, including the leaves and petals. After eating as little as a single leaf or petal, a cat may start to vomit 24-48 hours later. Unless aggressively treated with intravenous fluids and possibly dialysis, the cat will die from kidney failure. Dogs are not affected.

If a cat is known to have eaten parts of a lily, it should be taken to a veterinarian immediately, especially if the cat is vomiting. Timely treatment is essential for the cat to have a chance at recovering from kidney failure.
